HOW TO REMOVE YOUR HAIR EXTENSIONS

Before beginning your in-home removal, it is key to prepare for the removal process. To make your removal easier it is recommended that you wait an additional week or two past your normal service time. Having an extra set of hands will greatly help – consider asking a friend, family member or aid to assist you. Be sure to set aside uninterrupted time for your removal. Remember more remover is not better and will NOT release your hair addition faster. And MOST IMPORTANTLY be patient with yourself as you go through the following removal steps:

- 1. First, using a clip or scrunchie, separate all hair extension hair away from your growing hair so that you are able to easily access the hair extension line
- 2. Next, wrap the cotton rope around your head twice, being sure the cotton rope is just below your hair extension line.
- 3. Securely tie the cotton rope in front of your forehead to capture excess Remover that may run down when applying.
- 4. Next, refer to your Personal Attachment Guide to determine what remover to use for each hair extension line.

PLEASE NOTE: YOU MAY ONLY NEED ONE REMOVER. YOU MAY ALSO NEED TO USE BOTH REMOVERS FOR ONE LINE.

- 5. Next, squirt or spray a small amount of selected remover along top of the extension line.
- 6. Give the remover time to work allowing it to sit for one minute while you gently massage the remover into hair extension using your fingers.
- 7. Next, saturate a Q-Tip with remover and work the Q-Tip under the hair extension to help spread the remover and release the attachment from the hair. Be sure to take your time and allow the remover to work. Remember more remover does not release faster only makes it harder to clean up.

- 8. Continue to reapply additional remover, little by little, being sure to gently work it into the hair extensions with your fingers.
- 9. Once hair extension line loosens gently slide the hair extension line out of growing hair.
- 10. Lastly, place the hair extension line on a towel to allow it to dry. Then be sure to bring in with you when you come in for your next full-service appointment.

Please repeat all steps for each hair extension line. <u>Be sure to refer to your</u>
<u>Personal Attachment Guide for each hair extension line</u> as the remover that is used could be different for each line and in some cases both removers may be needed for the same line.

Note: Do not be alarmed if you see hairs attached to the hair extension these are a part of your normal daily hair shedding (a healthy part of the hair growth cycle). These hairs have accumulated over the month period of time and are held by the adhesive to the hair extension line.
